

## National Mission: Our approach



#### Additional £250m for lifetime of this parliament

- Harm Reduction: focusing on harm reduction and preventing fatal overdose.
- Improving Treatment: through the introduction of Medication Assisted Treatment Standards and complementary treatment target and widening access to residential rehab.
- Workforce and culture: taking a rights-based approach to reduce stigma and support staff
- Holistic support: cross cutting and reliant on delivery of priorities beyond the scope of the drugs policy division.




## **Delivery: Harm Reduction**

#### Two-fold increase in the distribution of Naloxone

- New routes click and deliver and peer supply
- Emergency service initiatives including police carriage
- Over 100k kits distributed



## Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) Standards: Published May 2021

Ten evidence-based standards to enable consistent delivery of safe, accessible, high-quality drug treatment across Scotland.








#### **Residential Rehab:**

- Target to increase the number of statutory funded residential rehab placements to 1,000 a year by 2026
- Target to increase the number of beds to 650 by 2026

#### **National Mission Evaluation**

#### **Evidence of impact**

ADP Coordinator Survey: MAT standards perceived as already having made a positive impact by **9 in 10** 

Lived Experience Survey: **7 in 10** felt support from services better than two years ago

Frontline Staff Survey: **3 in 4** agreed with at least one statement about a positive impact of the National Mission on their own practice

Key Informant Interviews: National Mission cash injection seen as a positive impact

#### **Areas for Improvement**

Opportunities for **recovery-oriented support**: counselling and mental health support

Improved coordination of **reporting requirements** and **governance arrangements**for local areas


Expanding the support offer to **non-opiates**, including stimulants and alcohol

Greater focus on **prevention** and wider system throughout work

High levels of **pressure** throughout the system, including on frontline staff

### Post 2026: Next steps

- We are developing an alcohol and drug strategic plan for after the National Mission
- Over 30 stakeholder engagement sessions held, including:
  - Living experience sessions
  - ADP coordinator sessions
  - Policy specific stakeholders e.g. families, harm reduction
  - Ministerial roundtables: Inverness, Glasgow, Edinburgh and virtual.
- Expected publication is early 2026, ahead of the completion of the National Mission
